## EXAMPLES TO GUIDE YOU IN LIQUID FORMULATIONS.

Oral hydromorphone. If in your country, hydromorphone is available in oral liquid formulation in $5 \mathrm{mg} / 5 \mathrm{~mL}$ in 10 mL bottles, and the patient has to pay in order to access the medication, complete as follows:


Injectable morphine. If in your country morphine is available in $10 \mathrm{mg} / \mathrm{mL}$ ampoules and the smallest unit the patient can get is a box of 2 ampoules and is free for the patient, complete as follows:

Fentanyl patches. If in your country fentanyl patches are available in doses of $25 \mathrm{mcg} / \mathrm{h}$,the smallest selling unit the patient can buy is a box of 5 patches and the patient has to pay in order to access the medication, complete as follows:


Methadone. If in your country, methadone is available and the smallest dosage unit is 10 mg in a bottle of 30 tablets/capsules, and the patient has to pay in order to access the medication, complete as follows:
